How to get there

- By Car
Located adjacent to the Maritime Museum; approximately 36km south of Surfers Paradise, takes about 45 minutes; approximately 5km south of Coolangatta Airport, takes about 10 minutes; approximately 110km south of Brisbane Airport, takes about 1 hour 20 minutes.

Tweed River Pot to Plate Adventure Cruise

Led by Yugambeh Aboriginal Tribe Member (Luther Cora), retrace the footsteps of our Indigenous elders and learn more about traditional hunting versus today's commercial practices. Bamboo spears are provided as you wade through the mangrove forests to hunt for mud crabs, stingrays and fish (waterproof waders provided). Enjoy alfresco sand bank dining (tide permitting), while the mornings catch is cooked on a bonfire and celebrate the local Aboriginal culture as you enjoy Yugambeh stories and didgeridoo playing.

Re-embark the vessel and cruise through the oyster leases, taste freshly shucked oysters, pull up commercial crab pots, feed the pelicans and seabirds and try your luck at fishing. Feast on freshly prepared seafood including mud and spanner crabs, prawns, oysters, salads, bread and fruit complimented with a cheese board and unlimited beer, wine and soft drinks
