How to get there

• By Car

Located approximately 14km south of Margaret River, takes about 15 minutes; approximately 67km south of Busselton Visitor Centre, takes about 55 minutes; approximately 292km south of Perth, takes about 3 hour 15 minutes.

• OVERVIEW •

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This magical cave is a natural time capsule; home to ancient fossil remains of long-extinct giant animals. A fascinating audio tour is available in several languages. Mammoth Cave is the most easily accessed of all the show caves in the region, with wheelchair access into the first chamber.



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Mammoth Cave is a self-guided cave, where visitors explore along the boardwalks and platforms, through the majestic chambers of the cave. This is much more than a cave - it is a complete nature experience.

Smaller groups of visitors will pick up an MP3 self-guided audio tour to get started; available in English, French, German, Malay and Mandarin.

Entering the cave through bushland via a gently sloping boardwalk, visitors quickly realise just how much there is to see here.

Over 10,000 fossils had at one time accumulated inside the cave; upon excavating, many of these were found to be remains of Australian Megafauna (giant animals) that became extinct around 46,000 years ago. There is even a 50,000-year-old 'zygomaturus' jawbone embedded in the cave wall.

After exiting the cave, there is the option of a walk along the beautiful Marri Trail. Visitors during the winter and spring months will see a stream flowing through the cave, with the water stained red from natural tannins.
