How to get there

By Ferry

The Zoo is located just 12 minutes from Circular Quay by ferry. Refer to Sydney Ferries website for a current timetable.

By Car

Parking is available at the Zoo. Entry to the car park is from Bradleys Head Road. The car park day rate is \$18. (Price is reference only, and subject to change without notice)
